

Veteran Printer Dies at 86

John F. Freeman, one of the original employes of The Binghamton Press, died Saturday night in the Union Printers Home, Colorado Springs, Colo. He was 86.

Mr. Freeman, who had worked in newspaper composing rooms for 62 years before retiring in 1954, moved to Colorado from Binghamton about two years ago. He had been seriously ill for several weeks.



Funeral arrangements are set tentatively for tomorrow in Colorado Springs.

Born in Chesterfield, England, Mr. Freeman came to the United States as a child with his mother and two sisters.

MAIN INTERESTS

He entered the printing trade as a youth in the New York City area and the trade, the International Typographical Union and newspapers were his major interests through most of his life.

Around the turn of the century, Mr. Freeman worked for the Ithaca News. Frank E. Gannett, who later was to build the Gannett Group of Newspapers, was city editor at the time.

Word got around in the trade in the spring of 1904 that a new paper—The Binghamton Press—was to be started, and Mr. Freeman came down from Ithaca to take a job as a printer.

About the time of the start of World War 1, Mr. Freeman moved on to the Brooklyn Eagle, where he stayed 19 years, serving part of that time as superintendent of the composing room.

In 1934, he returned to Binghamton, and alternated between The Binghamton Press and the Binghamton Sun. He was for a time a foreman of the Sun composing room. Then he rejoined the Press composing room staff permanently and worked there until he retired.

BIRTHDAY DINNER

In 1950, the widely-scattered family of Mr. Freeman came to Binghamton to felicitate him on his 80th birthday. Some 25 persons attended a dinner on the occasion.

In 1952, he was a central figure at the observance of the 65th anniversary of the founding of Binghamton Local 232, ITU, and received an emblem for his 60 years as a member of the union.

His last Binghamton residence was at 55½ Walnut Street. For some time after retiring, he lived with the family of a daughter, Mrs. Robert Johnston, in the Town of Binghamton.

Other survivors are two sons, Fred E. Freeman of Johnson City and John F. Freeman, Jr., of Elmhurst, Ill.; three daughters, Mrs. Walter T. Wittman of Paramus, N. J., Mrs. Charles Shipley of Coolidge, Ariz., and Miss Elizabeth Freeman of Hackensack, N. J.; a sister, Miss Jane Freeman of New York City; 11 grandchildren, and four great-grandchildren.

Fifth Ward Candidate for Alderman

During the past few years more homes have been built in this ward than in any other ward of the city. The opening up of territory to builders has been the cause of this in a large degree. On account of this many improvements will be needed in that direction within the near future, and the selection of alderman will be important at this time. The next representative should be one whose interests lie in that direction and who has a home of his own there.

Mr. Freeman has been active in the life of our city. For the past three years he has been president of the Typographical Union in this city. The new adjustment of the scale of wages for the printers was made while he was in that office, and it was one of the most difficult problems ever confronted by any body of men. He and the employing printers met and finally made an agreement which holds good for five years. It was done in a business manner and when it was adjusted it was the opinion of the employing printers that there would be little labor difficulties if all union men took the business view of matters that Mr. Freeman took during the controversy, unless the employers themselves refused to be as fair as he was.

He works on the Press. He is recognized as one of the best workmen. He is a safe man, because he is fearless, fair and fully intelligent. While his record as a union man entitles him to respect in the way he views unionism, the manner of his conducting his duties as a union man proves him capable to act in a public trust also.

Former Sun Printer Dies In Colorado

John F. Freeman, a veteran of 62 years in newspaper printing rooms and a former foreman in The Binghamton Sun composing room, died in the Union Printers Home, Colorado Springs, Colo., Saturday night.

Mr. Freeman, 86, moved from Binghamton to Colorado about two years ago. He had been seriously ill for several weeks.

From the time he entered the printing trade as a young man in New York City, Mr. Freeman's primary interest was in newspapers.

In the early 1900s, Mr. Freeman worked for the Ithaca News, where Frank E. Gannett was city editor. Mr. Gannett later established the Gannett Group of Newspapers.

Mr. Freeman left Ithaca in 1904 and was one of the original employes of the Binghamton Press. He worked on the Brooklyn Eagle for about 19 years, starting at about the time of World War I.

He returned to Binghamton in 1934 and worked alternately for both The Binghamton Sun and the Binghamton Press for a number of years.

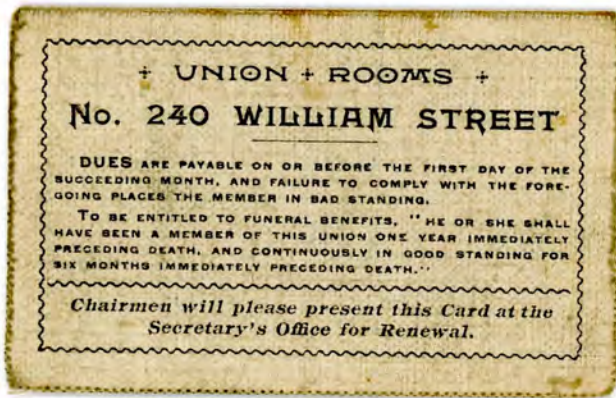

Dues

ALL members are required to pay one dollar per month as per capita tax; the pension, mortuary and defense assessments of 2½%, plus local dues of 1%, on total earnings.

Dues for any month must be paid on or before the tenth of the next succeeding month or, the member will subject himself to a fine of \$1.00.

Every member must demand, and shall receive on payment of the proper sum, due stamps for each month's dues paid.

Every member to whose card International due stamps, showing all dues and assessments paid up to the current month, are not attached is delinquent to the International Union. Members of this union stand suspended when they are four months in arrears for local or International dues or assessments. Suspended members have no standing in the organization and are not entitled to benefits. Any one suspended for non-payment of dues and assessments can be reinstated only in the manner provided in the laws of the International Typographical Union.

THE HOLDER hereof, by his payment of dues according to law, protects his interests in the several benefits of the International Typographical Union, including admission to the Union Printers Home, the Old Age Pension and the Mortuary Benefit.

DUES

ALL members are required to pay sixty cents per month as per capita tax and the old-age pension assessment at the rate of one-half of one per cent. on their total earnings, and the mortuary assessment at the rate of one-half of one per cent. on their total earnings to the International Typographical Union, in addition to local dues and an assessment of one-half of one per cent. on total earnings to the Local Old Age Pension Fund or Out-of-Work Special Reserve Fund; also the International 44-hour week assessment at a rate determined by the Executive Council.

EVERY member must demand and shall receive on payment of the proper sum, due stamps for each month's dues paid.

EVERY member to whose card International due stamps showing all dues and assessments up to the current month to have been paid, are not attached, shall be deemed as delinquent to the International Union and shall not be entitled to any benefits. Members of subordinate Unions STAND SUSPENDED WHEN FOUR MONTHS IN ARREARS FOR LOCAL OR INTERNATIONAL DUES OR ASSESSMENTS. Suspended members shall have no standing in the organization and are entitled to no benefits. Anyone suspended for non-payment of dues and assessments can only be reinstated in the manner provided in the laws of the International Typographical Union.
