Gloria Batavia Warshaw, executive director of Family Services of Bergen County, died Friday. The Paramus resident, formerly of Paterson, was 62.

She joined the agency in 1968 after serving as director of Hospital Home Care Service, associated with Barnert Memorial Hospital in Paterson, for seven years.

"Helping families and individuals discover new ways to grapple with and resolve life's problems is one of the greatest rewards that social work can bring," she said in a 1975 interview with The Record.

She was a former president and member of the Paramus Board of Education in the late 1950's and had also worked for the Ridgewood Family Counseling Service.

She was chairwoman of the Bergen County Coalition for the Homeless, which she helped found in 1983.

Her last achievement before becoming ill in January was to develop a county AIDS program that is being funded by the United Way for 1986-87.

She was a member of the National Committee of Family Services America which is composed of agencies, executives, and other community leaders.

She attended the University of Wisconsin and received a BS degree from New York University. She obtained a master's degree in social work from the University of Pennsylvania School of Social Work.

Surviving are two daughters, Debra Warshaw Taube of Narberth, Pa., and Marya Warshaw Chu of Brooklyn; her mother, Rose Waks Batavia of Paterson, and one grandchild.

A memorial service will be held at the convenience of the family. Arrangements are by the Vander Plaat Funeral Home in Paramus. Visiting will be today from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the Warshaw residence in Paramus.
